Station was commissioned by the Nairobi City County Govern Dr. Evans Kidero.

The project was initiated and driven into realization in 2011/2012 by the Hon FT Nyammo whom recruited the current Karen Police Station Rehabilitation



Committee and then galvanized the support of the KLDA.

Initial concept for the project was brought about by the genuine concern for the low morale and resultant poor service received from our Karen Police Force which was in most part as a direct result of very poor working conditions within the Karen Police Station. This was not surprising since there had

been little change in the building from the days when it was built as a Forestry Station back in the early 1940s! Time has come for the local community both residential and corporate business – to accept some



social moral responsibility towards those to whom we all look to for help and protection in time of crisis and need. We hope and believe that the police will tighten up the team to deal with the increasing insecurity issues reported weekly within the community.
